Timeline & Process

EXPLORE



Needs Assessment:

- **Identify gaps:** Conduct a thorough assessment to identify any gaps or inconsistencies in the current curriculum.
- **Analyze student data:** Examine student performance data to pinpoint areas where improvement is needed.
- **Gather stakeholder input:** Involve teachers, administrators, parents, and community members in the needs assessment process to ensure that the curriculum aligns with their expectations.

Curriculum Selection Criteria:

- Does it prepare students for college, career, and citizenship?

4. **Integration and Cross-Curricular Collaboration**

- Does the curriculum facilitate interdisciplinary connections by providing opportunities for teachers to connect content across different subject areas?
- Does the curriculum support the development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills through interdisciplinary learning?

5. **Technology Integration:**

- Does the curriculum effectively integrate technology to enhance learning and prepare students for the digital age?
- Are there opportunities for students to use technology to solve problems, create content, and collaborate with others?

6. **Assessment:**

- Does the curriculum include a variety of assessments that measure student understanding and progress?
- Are the assessments aligned with the learning objectives and standards?

Additional Considerations

- **Equity and inclusion:** Ensure that the curriculum promotes equity and inclusion for all students, regardless of their background or abilities.
- **Parental involvement:** Involve parents in the curriculum adoption process and provide them with opportunities to support their children's learning.
